## **CORE ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES:**

### **Teaching and Curriculum Development:**

I have over 20 years of university teaching experience (between the University of Pretoria and the University of the Witwatersrand). At the Wits School of Law, I have mostly taught constitutional and human rights law, in various iterations, at undergraduate (LLB) and Masters (LLM) level. Through the years, this has from time to time been supplemented by private law teaching, notably in fields of health law, family law and property law; as well as by guest lectures on health-related aspects of constitutional and human rights law in the Wits Faculty of Health Sciences.

During my years at the University of the Witwatersrand, I have developed and modified curricula, at LLM and LLB level, in various subjects (including health law, human rights law and constitutional law). I have also provided LLB curriculum review advice to the University of Pretoria Faculty of Law (2008) and assisted Monash University: South Africa with the development of a constitutional law curriculum (2017).
